## Vision trip details

My visa for Papua New Guinea came in! Oddly enough, I didn't get an email about it. But the visa website has an approved status along with the official document, so... PNG, here I come!

I'm flying out on **October 21**<sup>st</sup> on Korean Air to Manila, where I'll have 24 hours to tour that city before proceeding on Philippine Airlines to Port Moresby, the capital of PNG. There will be an SIL-operated flight waiting for me there to take me straight to Ukarumpa, the missionary base where I'll be staying for 5 weeks in a friend's house.

In Ukarumpa, I'll be doing some work with the IT team there, observing Bible translation, and generally getting a better idea of whether or not that is where God has called me. I'll also get to meet a number of people in Tyndale and SIL who I've only talked with on video or email.

On **December 1**st, I'll take another SIL flight back to Port Moresby, where Air Niugini will take me to Cairns, Australia. After visiting the Kuranda rainforest and the Great Barrier Reef, I'll fly on Qantas to Uluru/Ayer's Rock for a couple of nights. Then taking Jetstar to Sydney for a few days, and then Fiji Airlines back to Dallas, where I'll arrive back on **December 9**th.

#### **Spiritual Thoughts**


Not long ago, I spent some time with a friend who has recently renounced Christianity and walked away from the Lord. During that time, I was praying and wondering how to reach him and win him back to Christ.

Then at small group, an older woman gave me some advice which helped put my mind at ease. To paraphrase,

"God is the one who is calling him. You just be a good friend."

It might be humbling or discouraging to know that although God can use us for reaching others, we ultimately have no control in those situations.

On the other hand, that lack of control is also freeing. Knowing that it's between him and God—and knowing that God will do a much better job of calling him than I ever could—lifts the burden of responsibility that I had taken onto my own shoulders, and puts it on Christ's.
