Allison

It started as a tiny scratch and almost ended in tragedy.

"The doctors in Australia told me I was within 24-hours of losing my leg. A tiny scratch on my right thigh had become severely infected. It was a huge, painful effort to arrange transport out of the village. The pain was so bad, I could not walk. Five days passed before getting transportation. The doctor in the main port determined a flight to Australia was needed. The infection had engulfed a majority of my right thigh. A fast response vessel could have reached our village early on and saved me from 7 reconstructive leg surgeries"

Amputee

Amputees on remote islands in Melanesia receive very little assistance after surgery.

"The greatest challenge we face in Vanuatu is the distances over open-ocean to reach patients and communities in need. Vanuatu is made up of 83 islands and many people in the smaller islands have very little income or access to transportation. The best solution for assisting amputees would be to have a mobile casting clinic to go to the islands, cast the limbs and return to Port Vila to make the limbs. We would then return to the islands to fit, modify and assist with training and mobility of our patients." Michael Shugg, Founder Vanuatu Amputee Association" — Amputee

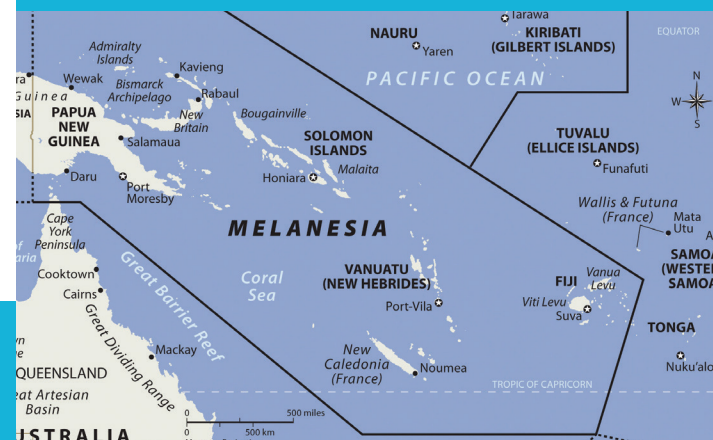
> Create a dedicated island ambulance service!
