

About 20% of Honey Bee's Carrots are Ready to Chop

I'm thinking of an analogy to help us understand how the Honey Bee app works. Let's say you want to make a grated apple-carrot salad with the help of your electric food processer. You are the user, the chef, the brains, the hands. The food processor with its motor, blades and strong lidded container is like the app software — it's a non-thinking machine that helps process or chop up the food. Finally, you have food - carrots and apples, in this case - which you want to change from their bulky, large crunchy form into the form of soft, integrated pieces, easy to chew.

While waiting for the Honey Bee app processer machine to get built, another small team of us Bible geeks have been steadily working on preparing the food which the users -- local translators -- will eventually process with the app to transform into a delicious salad. We Bible geeks go to markets and shop for the best carrots and apples, sort and wash them thoroughly, and gather them into an easily accessible place. We are getting the Food ready which the translator-chefs are going to process through the Honey Bee machine to transform that Food into another form of itself, sweet and juicy for their local language communities to consume. We Food preparers have about 20% of the whole Bible ready to be put into the HB app. See the pie chart for some specifics.
