Report Overview

- 1 month "on mission"
- \$19,310 contributed for this work
- 31 prayer partners via a virtual group joined me each day
- 4 countries; 4 currencies; 10 beds (3 in transit)
- 1 BT conference and 3 oral translation workshops
- 2 apps: **SPadv** (the Story app) & **Honey Bee** (for oral Bible translation)
- 42 language communities (130 ppl) trained
- 3 elephants encountered

Bible Translation Conference in Chiang Mai



~500 attended; many presentations & discussions. I also presented a <u>paper</u>

Theme: "Ethics in BT"

Hot topics:

- 1. how languages are counted
 - usually by outsiders: ~7500.
 - o If local speakers counted, the number would be 35,000+
- 2. types of BT project models:
 - o Outsider owned, funded, controlled, done
 - Outsider owned, funded, co-done w/ local believers
 - o Insider owned, funded, controlled, done
- 3. written text vs. oral-audio
- 4. One-time, partial Scripture product vs. full Scripture publication with perpetual revisions



Bible Translation Conference in Chiang Mai

- Enjoyed re-connecting with and was refreshed by friends and colleagues from my previous "worlds" of PNG, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Media...
- Found a technical networking partner (aquifer.bible) by which to spread our Easy to Translate (E2T) version + Brief Exegetical Notes (BEN) outside of Honey Bee app.











Elephant encounter #1 in Thailand

To join me on this elephant encounter I was connected by a mutual friend to Zim, a vibrant refugee from the 70-year war in Myanmar whose father is a translator in a dangerous / persecuted situation. Zim helps her father when she can.



Delay & different door for Entering India

- Our "sheepy" plan was for me to fly from Chiang Mai to BKK to HYDerabad, India, get a visa on arrival, then drive with Prem to his city (Karimnagar) 4 hours away for several days of workshop prep, visit with my Indian host family, and daily preach at small house church meetings. Then drive back to HYD with Prem and Angel, and fly to Indore for the first HB training workshop.
- This plan failed when I found out I needed an online visa before I could fly into India. I paid \$200 to expedite a visa in 2 days, but it did not arrive. I re-booked my non-refundable flights twice, then did not know what to do. We prayed. It was stressful!


Our people don't understand Hindi, so now we can get the Bible in our own Ghahara language.

Complications of India

- 20+ different state languages (and scripts)
- 1000s of local languages & dialects
- High illiteracy and poverty
- Only ~100 languages have Scriptures (many done by outsiders or outdated)
- Most northern "Hindi"/Hindu nationalist states persecute Christians
- Heavy monsoon seasons create difficult travel logistics

HB translators came to Indore from 6 states

We took up a love offering and prayed for this translator who came to the training directly after getting released from being in jail for 2 months, starved and mistreated. He was charged with "terrorism" for hosting a prayer meeting in his house where 75 people had gathered.



Transitioning to Karimnagar (hometown) for the next HB training





- Flew with Prem & Angel from IDR to HYD in the evening
- Aby-Michael (Angel's brother) drove us 5 hours thru the night to Prem & Angel's home in Karimnagar city
- 1 day to recover, prep and shift to the Telugu HB training at the resort in the shadow of a major Hindu temple

Our wrap-up included breaking chapatis together, worship, encouragement, certificates, photos ... and games...!

In 3 days I learned many things about translation. This is very useful for my community! Thank you for coming!













The "Spontaneous Applause" Indicator








Something unexpected occurred that surprised me. Toward the end of the training, as I was demonstrating the ability of the HB app to combine in various ways their translated audio and video Scripture files, and to publish them immediately, sharing-distributing to their language community... all the participants broke out in spontaneous applause! This happened in both workshops. They were so pleased to easily, freely and quickly be able to spread the Word in their language with their people. I loved that!

Transitioning to Nepal



After a midnight arrival and rough start getting accommodations (the ** hotel I had pre-booked, changed ownership and name, so technically did not exist...), our host Daniyal (R) sorted out other logistics and we also finally connected with Pst. Irfan (center) who arrived from Pakistan.

Before the few tribal participants arrived to get training on the Story app, Daniyal arranged a special play day for us...!









Finally all the participants for the training arrived and settled in. We were a hodge-podge group whom the Good Shepherd had brought together for a few days to accomplish various things.







Everybody learned how to use the SPadv app to translate and publish Bible story videos. Jesus gave Daniyal good health and great patience the whole time to multi-task, facilitate, mediate, interpret, and organize logistics for two all-women tribal teams plus help his family and his in-laws.





We were not technically prepared to do a big training in Nepal. Daniyal has been struggling for 3 yrs to get Bible templates online and we needed in-person time to sort things out. Irfan needed to see the progression of a sample training. God has called and given vision to both Daniyal and Irfan to reach out to their 100+ tribal groups in Nepal and Pakistan respectively, with these oral translation apps, so the Good Shepherd gave us helpful mentoring time together. We all left encouraged.

Everybody has a story!

Sunil (red sweatshirt), quiet but gifted, came under a lot of stress with his wife Memuka and two young kids to this gathering. Memuka (Daniyal's sis-in-law) feels called to take this translation work to the tribes. Sunil's dad has tried to kill him because they are Christ followers. Sunil testified at our wrap-up time that God had given him courage to do voice narration for the Bible videos.





I'm a new believer, and very blessed to learn this tool. The Story app will help me learn and remember Bible stories to share with others. I'm the only believer in my family. I'm a man's 2nd wife, raising his first wife's sons. But I'm chosen by God and very happy to learn this tool – it will make it easier to share the gospel.


There are many idol
